

An Introduction To Hearing Aids

It is estimated that more than 28 million people in the US have a significant loss of hearing. For the majority of these people, a hearing aid will probably be the best way to improve their hearing. Recent advancements in hearing aid technology mean that modern hearing aids have a high level of sound quality in a very small device. It should be noted that a hearing aid will not restore normal hearing. What it can do is make it easier for the user to detect and interpret sounds. Often someone who is hard of hearing will not notice if someone is trying to speak to them. This is what a hearing aid will help with.

Although there are several distinct types of hearing aids on the market today, they all work in a similar fashion. A microphone or receiver picks up sound waves and converts them to an electric signal. This signal is then processed and sent to a speaker, which converts it back to an audio signal. The processing serves to amplify those frequencies of which the user has trouble hearing. Hearing aids are able to allow their user to hear human speech at a comfortable volume. This may require some time to adjust to the new signals the brain receives.

Hearing aids are not a perfect solution – they do have their limitations. They will not restore normal hearing, nor will they eliminate background noise. However, they may be adjusted to lessen background noise. New users to hearing aids often complain that their voices sound funny to themselves, and that they are bothered by the relative loud noise from things like refrigerator fans and traffic on the street outside. However, as they have a chance to adapt to their new hearing aid, their brain begins to filter out background noises to a more comfortable level.

There are different types of hearing loss. The two main types are conductive hearing loss and sensorineural hearing loss. Conductive hearing loss occurs when sound waves cannot reach the inner ear. This can be caused by such things as a buildup of earwax, infection, fluid in the ear, or a punctured eardrum. Sensorineural hearing loss occurs when there is damage to the auditory nerve or hair cells in the inner ear. This damage can be the result of loud noise, injury, infection, a genetic condition or aging. While conductive hearing loss can often be corrected by surgery, sensorineural hearing loss can not.

History Of Hearing Aids

A hearing aid is a device that helps someone who has trouble hearing. Hearing aids today are electronic instruments that receive and amplify sounds. The first hearing aids are now known as body worn aids. They are bulky instruments about the size of a deck of cards that are designed to be carried in a pocket. A wire connects the hearing aid to an earphone. Body worn aids are seldom used anymore, except occasionally in the case of very severe hearing loss.

The most common hearing aid type today is the behind the ear aid, or BTE. A behind the ear hearing aid consists of a case that clips behind the ear and is connected directly by plastic sound tubes to a custom molded earpiece. BTE's are used for a wide range of hearing losses. Behind the ear hearing aids generally have a larger battery than other types of hearing aids, allowing them to be more powerful and have a longer life.

With improved technology and miniaturization of electronics, the next generation of hearing aids, in the ear or ITE, became possible. These aids fit in the outer ear bowl. ITE's can be visible to the casual observer. They are also the largest of the custom made styles, and are often the most comfortable, cheapest and simplest to use. Smaller than the in the ear hearing aid is the in the canal, or ITC hearing aid. These aids are usually more expensive than ITE's, and are also harder to adjust owing to the small size of the volume wheel. Going even smaller we find the mini canal, or MC hearing aid. These are the smallest hearing aid you can get that still have a volume adjustment wheel.

The tiniest hearing aids made are the completely in the canal, or CIC hearing aids. They fit so deeply into the ear that they require a removal string. CIC's do not usually have manual controls simply because of their size.

Combining some of the attributes of the behind the ear and the completely in the canal hearing aids are the post auricular canal devices. This design physically separates the processor from the earpiece. The small processor fits behind the ear, while the receiver and speaker portion is imbedded in the earpiece which is placed deep in the ear canal.

Choosing a type of hearing aid is usually making a trade-off between size, price and flexibility.

Hearing Aids Inside Out

The largest hearing aids used today, the BTE's, are generally the cheapest, most powerful, easiest to adjust and the most durable. However, they are also the most conspicuous. BTE's tend to be the best choice for children, however, owing to their durability and the ability to replace the earpiece as the child grows. Other types of hearing aids would have to be replaced periodically when the child outgrows them.

There two types of hearing loss are conductive hearing loss and sensorineural hearing loss. These aids are usually more expensive than ITE's, and are also harder to adjust owing to the small size of the volume wheel. Even smaller than the ITC's are the mini canal, or MC, hearing aid. These are the smallest hearing aid you can get that still have a volume adjustment wheel. The tiniest hearing aids made are the completely in the canal, or CIC hearing aids. They fit so deeply into the ear that they require a removal string. CIC's do not usually have manual controls simply because of their size.

A feature available on many hearing aids is the telecoil. Telecoils allow the hearing aid to pick up magnetic signals and process them as audio signal. Telecoils were originally developed to help those with hearing aids use the telephone. Older telephone produced fairly strong magnetic fields in their earpieces, which could be picked up by the telecoil. Modern phones do not normally produce strong enough magnetic fields, but many phones and other devices are equipped to transmit to a telecoil anyway. Most users find that the telecoil provides better sound quality and allow the user to more easily concentrate on the desired sound, despite any background noise.

Before You Get Hearing Aids

The first step in getting a hearing aid is to visit an ear care professional to get a full hearing test. The professional will measure several different facets of your hearing, including how well you can hear different tones or frequencies, and how well you can discern speech with various levels of background noise. You should discuss with your doctor or audiologist whether a hearing aid is the best solution for you, or whether it is possible to correct your hearing loss through surgery. Next you'll want to investigate the different styles of hearing aids, and select the one that is right for you, your hearing loss, and your lifestyle. Most hearing aid companies offer a trial period, so don't hesitate to try more than one aid. You will want to check out what features are available with the different hearing aids. Two features which are especially useful are telecoil and direct audio input. These allow you to use assistive listening devices which can be purchased for your home and are available at some public locations.

An important consideration is the full cost of the hearing aid, including batteries and repairs. Make sure you ask what the warranty covers, as well as what is the length of the warranty. A person obtaining a hearing aid for the first time will need to take the time to become familiar with their hearing aid. It may be uncomfortable to start, or your voice may sound funny to yourself. Know how to adjust your hearing aid properly, and be sure to return to your audiologist or hearing aid dispenser for a proper adjustment if it is not comfortable.

Maintaining Your Hearing Aids

It is very important to maintain your hearing aid properly. Hearing aids are delicate instruments, and looking after them is vital. You will need to know how to clean your hearing aid by removing wax buildup, how to replace and dispose of batteries and how to remove moisture from the aid. In order to properly maintain your hearing aid you will want a battery tester and spare batteries, silica gel packs and a plastic stethoscope. You will want to keep your hearing aid clean by wiping it daily with a dry tissue. Moisture is the enemy of your hearing aid, so do not wash it, even with a damp cloth. The silica gel packs are used to prevent moisture from getting into your hearing aid while you are not wearing it. The most common maintenance you will have to do is to replace dead batteries. You will want to replace dead batteries immediately. Remember, in order to prolong the battery life you will want turn off your hearing aids when you're not using them.

A plastic stethoscope is a great tool to make sure your hearing aid is functioning correctly. Use the stethoscope to listen to the output of the hearing aid while you adjust it. You will want to test your hearing aid's response to different volumes and sounds and to check for the presence of static and that the hearing aid is not cutting in and out.

The only part of a hearing aid that should be washed is the ear mold piece of a behind the ear hearing aid. You can gently wash it with a mild detergent. A forced air blower can be used to dry the ear mold more quickly.

If you are having any problems with your hearing aid, take it back to the dispenser or audiologist. A badly functioning hearing aid will cause you discomfort, and decrease the benefit you could have received from it.

Hearing Aids And Children

As a child grows, the ear grows as well. The behind the ear style of hearing aid is preferred for children because the ear mold can be replaced separately from the rest of the unit. In the ear hearing aids would have to be replaced completely as the child outgrew them. In addition, behind the ear hearing aids are better for children because the ear mold and hearing aid can be more easily cleaned and maintained, the controls are more easily adjusted and monitored by parents. And as any parent knows, because behind the ear hearing aids are larger and less likely to get lost, this will save you considerable expense in replacements.

For most children, the real need for a hearing aid comes at school. Without being able to hear properly, a child will miss instructions from their teacher, leading to frustration and poor performance. For children with hearing problems, many schools now will provide assistive learning systems. In these systems, the teacher is typically given a microphone, and the signal is sent directly to the hearing impaired student via either a telecoil or direct audio input. This type of set-up tends to be more effective for the child as it eliminates the amplification of background noise.

In the ear hearing aids are not suitable for young children because the aid must then be replaced frequently as the child grows. Once the child is in their teens, however, their ears will have reached their adult size, and they would be able to wear an in the ear hearing aid if so desired.

Batteries For Hearing Aids

You have hearing aids but have a hard time changing the batteries or are not sure when the batteries should be changed. If you are sure that you're hearing aids are on and you aren't hearing right this might not mean that your hearing aids are broke just that it is time to replace the batteries.

For a guideline to help you remember when you should change the batteries in you're hearing aid; you should at least change them every two weeks. Though you might find that this is too often, mark two weeks on a calendar and see when your hearing starts to decrease. You can mark this on the calendar and go by that.

Though your hearing aid batteries might drain faster the longer you leave you're hearing aids on. Make sure that you turn them off during the night; this will save the battery life. Though, if you are using them a lot during the time that you are using them, the batteries will drain faster.

If you have or are going to get digital hearing aid some of these hearing aids have a low battery warning. These hearing aids will beep to tell you that you have so many hours before the battery stop working. This is a great way to remind yourself if you don't remember when you placed in your last set of batteries.

One important thing is to do is to use a good brand of batteries right from the package. There are special batteries cases that you can buy that will help you change the batteries in you're hearing aids. These might be a little bit more money but they'll save you time from changing around the small batteries. Once you have changed the batteries a few times, you should have it down pat.

Hearing Aids: Policies And Warranties

With digital hearing aids the technology that are used for these are the best that has been made. You should look at all the researches you need that can help you narrow down what kind of hearing aid that you need. With so many brands that you can pick from you might have a hard time deciding from what you need.

It might be best to start with the top brands. Research what they have to offer. Keep notes of all the information that you find. This will help you remind yourself what you have found and prices. You might even want to look at the companies return policies and see if they have a no risk evaluation period.

If you find a company that has good policies then you should be able to try hearing aids for so many days risk free. This can help you decide if you can use them. Remember that hearing aids are something that will take a while to get use to. You might have to change the volume and make sure that they work for you before you decide to return them.

You might even find that some companies have warranties that you can get. This will be a good idea to buy. Some warranties might only last for a year. But if you look around you might find that there are longer warranties. This is something that will be a plus for you in case something happens to your hearing aids.

There is also a chance that you might get a supply of batteries with the purchase of your hearing aids. This can be a plus, you won't have to go out and look for batteries when they are needed. One thing to make sure that you look for is that you find a company that has offers that can help you.

Hearing Aids: Just One Or Two?

If you've been looking into getting hearing aids and believe that using only one hearing aid will be enough. The answer is no. You have two ears so you need both hearing aids to be on and working for you to be hearing right. Each ear will pick up different sounds for you to process.

If you have been to a doctor and know that you have different hearing in each ear then you should know if you need a different volume for each ear. This is simply done with getting digital hearing aids. These hearing aids can be tuned to the volume you need.

If you are just using one hearing at the moment you might be start realizing that you are missing parts of a conversation. Or maybe you aren't catching words that are spoken to the ear that has no hearing aid. If you know that this is the case then you should get your hearing checked.

Getting your hearing checked can be the quickest way to know if what kind of hearing aids you need. Once you've had your hearing checked and find out that your hearing had decreased. Then you should look into getting digital hearing. These hearing aids will be able to be changed with your hearing needs.

If you know you are planning on getting new hearing aids, with the internet these days you can find hearing aids for sale. This might be a cheaper way to buy your hearing aids then buying them from a local store. If you don't have access to a computer, ask a family member.

Using one hearing aid will not improve your hearing needs. You should be using two hearing aids at all time. It will make your hearing much better and you'll be able to follow conversation and listen to music and TV much easily.

One thing you should at least know some about when you go out to buy anything, more so when you're planning on buying some hearing aids. Knowing terms will help you know what you're looking at when you decide to buy hearing aids. Even if you're a planning on buying digital hearing aids some of the terms below will help you. Some terms you should look for are:

- **Analog:** this type is found the most in hearing aids. They do how ever make all sounds the

same equal in volume.

- **Assistance Listening Devices:** these are a variety of instruments, (phones, clocks, baby monitors, etc) which help the hearing impaired.
- **Behind the Ear:** these hearing aids are worn behind the ears.
- **Cochlear:** a part of the inner ear.
- **Completely in the Canal:** This hearing aid fits down into the canal of the ear and you won't be able to see it. Because of how small this hearing aid is it might not be the right choice for people with severe hearing loss.
- **Conductive Hearing Loss:** hearing impairment caused by interference with sound. This kind of hearing loss can mean disease, infection or trauma.
- **Decibels:** a unit measurement that relates to sound.
- **In the Canal:** These are similar to CIC but this type is larger and doesn't fit right into the ear canal.
- **In the Ear:** These hearing aids are they kind that fit in the outer ear. They are used for a wide range of hearing loss. This type of hearing aid is larger than others. ITE hearing aids can be used around technology also.

All these terms can help you when you buy your hearing aids. From digital hearing aids to a different type of hearing aid, reaching and knowing what is out there will save you time in finding the right hearing aids.

Hearing Aids Pain

If you have just bought hearing aids and they are causing pain, or even causing other problems you should stop wearing them for a few days and see if the problems go away. If not you should go see a doctor right away. If the pain doesn't go away after not wearing the aids for a few days then you could talk to the maker of you're hearing aids.

There is a chance that your hearing aids are too large for your ears. If that is the problem then you might need to get smaller hearing aids. If they aren't too large, then there is a possibility they have some rough spots on the earring aids that need to be filed down. You will want to take your hearing aids to a specialized to do this.

If you are just buying any kind of digital hearing aids then you should make sure the company you are buying them at, online or not has a so many risk free trial. This will let you know if the hearing aids that you bought will work for you. To do this you need to wear the hearing aids. If you develop pain after so long then you should contact the company and see what they suggest.

You're goal is not to go without you're hearing aids to cut down on the pain. But to stop the pain so you can continue to use you're hearing aids. Trying to let you're ears heal for a while before you wear you're hearing aids.

If you've tried everything, the next best coarse of action is to go to you're doctor. From there you can get you're hearing aids fixed. Make sure that you do get you're hearing aids fixed. You bought you're hearing aids to hear well. They can't help you if you aren't wearing them.

All About Open Fit Hearing Aids

With so many hearing aids on the market to choose from, you may be overwhelmed by the choices offered. In this article, we will discuss open fit hearing aids. With an open fit aid, you don't have to wait for your ear mold to be made and returned to you; so it takes less time to get the product you'll need. Buying these from a dealer is quicker than waiting on a manufacturer. They'll be maintained wherever you choose to purchase yours. Since open fit aids have evolved into more discreet, less bulky aids, made with better colors and user friendly designs of better quality, people are more willing to wear their hearing aids.

It is hard for some people to admit that they need help to function properly physically. Although there is nothing shameful about getting help for your hearing, it is often a matter of pride for a person to be afraid to give in and accept the use of an aid. Children especially have a fear of enduring teasing and insults from other children if they have anything outstandingly different about their appearance. For older adults, it may be interpreted as a sign of weakness or of getting older.

Open fit hearing aids are also known as over-the-ear, or OTE hearing aids. They are made small for the discretion of the wearer, fitting behind the ear with a clear, thin, almost invisible plastic tube going into the ear towards the ear canal.

These aids are actually best for high frequency hearing defects. If you didn't know already, there are many differences from one person to another when it comes to hearing loss. The loss can occur on many different levels and be at different stages. With the open fit aids, you get power and the most circuit options from many other aids for the high frequency defects.

These OTE aids are also called BTE, or behind-the-ear aids. Their plastic tubing and ear mold will conduct the sound and keep the ear mold more open. Children are often best benefited by these open fit aids, although many adults wear them as well. These aids are made with bright colors and decorations for the children.

One of the possible problems a person could have with an open fit hearing aid is if a tiny hairline crack develops in the plastic tubing. You'll want to take great care with your new aid to protect it

from abuse, both by yourself or by others. It should never be left where a child could grab it and chew on it or step on it or where any pets could get to it.

Although it is possible to buy hearing aids yourself without being tested, it is always wiser to have an accurate hearing test done to make sure whether or not your hearing condition requires more than just a simple, over-the-counter type hearing aid. Because the ear is such a complex part of the human body, a trained professional is best to get you the preferred help for your condition. Please take your ears seriously!

Are Deals On BTE Hearing Aids By Mail Too Good To Be True?

BTE hearing aids can be very costly if you go to your hearing professional to get them. Some people with hearing loss enjoy the privacy and convenience of ordering BTE hearing aids by mail. They feel that they can get a better deal and save themselves a trip to the doctor's office. But, are these deals too good to be true?

One thing to be aware of is that so-called hearing aids that do not meet FDA guidelines and simply amplify sound are actually known as listening devices. They are very cheap, both in price and in quality. Some BTE hearing aids by mail like this cost as little as \$6.99 per ear. In this case, you probably get what you pay for.

If sellers are not going through an ENT doctor, they will be required by the FDA to make sure that you sign a waiver and turn it in to them. They want to make sure that burden rests squarely on your shoulders. And, maybe it should. You do want to make your own decisions about BTE hearing aids by mail, and this is what you will have to do if you choose not to be fitted by an ENT.

In any case, most hearing aid sellers require the results of a hearing test, which can be done by an audiologist. They will not sell the BTE hearing aid by mail without one. An audiologist is simply a person who does tests on hearing. They are not medical doctors and cannot determine if you have an illness or other medical condition. However, they can deliver an audiogram that can be used to adjust the settings on a hearing aid.

The best deals on BTE hearing aids by mail, according to price, are to be found on E-Bay. One reconditioned hearing aid was recently sold there for under \$70. It was a Beltone brand hearing aid that was said to have cost over \$1000 new. The Siemens High Power 278 BTE aid was sold for around \$200. Siemens is a well respected brand name as well. Also available by signing a waiver was the Siemens Infinity Pro, which was priced at about \$400. If you can't afford a more expensive set, then you might consider trying this type of BTE hearing aids by mail.

Some sellers of hearing aids by mail expect to deal with hearing professionals. These vendors sell products that usually run the buyer into the thousands for a fraction of the cost. The Siemens Intuis is now being offered for a slim \$499, while its retail value is around \$1800. It is equipped with directional microphones, an auto phone device, and technology that reduce noise and feedback. It is a totally digital aid. There is a similar deal offered in another brand of hearing aid that has similar features. This one lists for \$2200 and sells on E-Bay for a mere \$399.

It may be to your advantage to buy BTE hearing aids by mail. It is always in your best interest to explore the possibilities. Just remember to find out what it is that you are actually getting for your money. After all, a few hundred dollars spent sounds a lot better than a few thousand, but if the hearing aids aren't what they claim to be, it may be a few hundred dollars wasted. And, who needs that?

Have You Heard Of Beltone Hearing Aids?

Your outside ear is really only there to collect and concentrate sound waves, which vibrate the air in your auditory canal. Air passes the vibration to the eardrum. The hammer bone, inside, is attached to the anvil and stirrup bones, which vibrate the oval window and the round window. This causes fluid to move in the cochlea, which encloses the Organ of Corti. This organ is covered with thousands of tiny hair cells which bring about chemical changes that change electrical potential to create nerve impulses. As you can tell, that little ear on the side of your head is just the beginning of the hearing process, which is a complex bodily instrument! There's more to the hearing process than what was just explained, and the Beltone company has known this for many years.

Beltone hearing aids have been around for at least 67 years, starting in 1940. Their models of digital hearing aids are of a wide variety. The shell styles include Beltone One!, (which is a mini behind-the-ear hearing aid), Beltone Corus, Beltone Linq, Beltone Access, Beltone Edge, Beltone Mira, Beltone Arca, Invisa (in the canal), Petite (in the canal), and the Opera Plus (in the canal).

Beltone has helped countless generations and brought hope and encouragement to many families and individuals who have relied upon their services. They provide other needs besides hearing aids, such as amplified cordless phones, loud alarm clocks, Blue tooth ear sets (\$145), neckloops (\$150), phone modules (\$50), and personal listening systems (\$170-\$200).

Beltone's listening systems help you hear in public places such as theaters. It can be hard to hear in public places even when you aren't hearing challenged. But those who are were limited for a long time to reading lips and interpreting actions when attending theaters, concerts, and other public events. This has caused them to miss out on much of the understanding they needed for proper processing of the information presented to the audience.

Hearing impaired people were also challenged in the way of waking up in the mornings, even with hearing aids. Many people don't feel a need to sleep with their aids, but when they did have to; they found the older aids uncomfortable for night time relaxation. A timer would be put on an overhead light so that when the light came on, the person would be awakened by the

brightness. This wouldn't work for the person who can sleep through anything! Even so, the timers couldn't be taken on trips. Wake up calls wouldn't help since the person couldn't hear the phone or a knock on the door. But there are devices now that vibrate, like Beltone's wake and shake alarm clock, which sells for \$70. It incorporates a vibration and a flashing strobe that comes on upon the time the alarm is set.

Beltone reaches as far as New England, Canada, and all across the United States; although, one drawback to finding a Beltone representative might be with the challenge of availability in small areas.

Batteries for hearing aids are sold by Beltone, but you can also find them many times in stores. Pharmacies usually carry hearing aid batteries. Typical name brand batteries can sell in a package of 4 for \$6. Eco-Gold batteries sell in a package of 6 for \$6. You can even order batteries from AARP magazines. They usually sell in bigger bundles than in a store, such as 42 for \$25, and offer a refund on the unopened packages if you aren't happy with the product.

Paying attention to your surroundings at all times isn't easy for anyone. It's even harder for those with hearing deficits. Sounds seem muffled or far away. Voices are indecipherable. other BTE's the speaker and microphone are separate from the speaker and rest behind and on the ear. The tubing they are connected with in this case is extremely small. In fact, all the microStyle hearing aids are similar in size of both the case of the hearing aids and of the tubing. They are also very lightweight.

Phonak hearing aids come in the usual styles. There are ITE, in the ear, hearing aids. These are fine for hearing loss that is not too severe. The BTE, behind the ear, aids are more appropriate for such user with any treatable level of hearing loss and also for children.

You'll often hear the term 'occlusion' when learning about hearing aids. This means something which blocks the passage. Like some hearing aids that make you feel like you have a big cotton ball stuffed in your ear, occlusion can make you more aware that you have a hearing loss. If you've ever gone under water and tried to hear someone speaking to you who is still above water, you can understand occlusion. You shouldn't feel intimidated by the big terms used when discussing hearing aids or hearing loss. A hearing aid is not simply to allow you to hear. It must also monitor, filter, clarify, receive, and control loudness. For many years, people who needed aids in both ears faced additional challenges. Siemens aids can ease that situation as well. If your ears were damaged because of an unhealthy exposure to loud noise on a constant and regular basis, damage to both ears is often the case. Two aids must be able to function well together rather than as 2 separate units for the best performance. The ones Siemens makes are meant to compliment each other and work as a team. The Artis e2e can be found for \$1500. Although with this aid, you do have the control to make manual adjustments, they work in sync. A remote control further aids your adjustment capabilities. It can work with only one aid or with an aid in each ear.

The Siemens Artis 2 Life sells for \$1100. Feedback is stopped before it happens so there's no uncomfortable squealing whistle to scare those around you. A high pitched sound breaking

through the air suddenly can keep a person on edge if it happens often. The Artis 2 Life has an adaptive directional microphone to help you get the most out of the system. It also offers wind screen and automatically adjusts for telephone usage. Battery life is 120 hours.

The Siemens Artis S sells for \$1600. The pocket remote is optional and has readouts for volume, program number, and battery life (a whopping 190 hours!). This aid is for mild to moderate loss.

Siemens also offers Artis hearing aids as a full shell, half shell, canal, mini canal, and CIC at price ranges from \$1350 to \$1450. All are available with the remote control option for \$150.

The Benefits Of Starkey Hearing Aids

Hearing aids have become so much more technologically advanced that they even include devices which allow the users to listen to IPODS! In-line telephone amplifiers can be carried on trips to help with hotel phone use. There are devices the hearing impaired can take to movie theaters to help them hear the movie while blocking out the unnecessary background noises.

One of the popular companies that seem to be on top with their innovating products that carry users into the future is Starkey. They have aids that will appeal to children as well as adults. If your child is embarrassed at the thought of having to learn to use a hearing aid, their feelings should be respected. Starkey can help ease the situation. It may help to have the child first try the hearing device at home for a short while before having them use it at school. Starkey has aids with helpful features that include a diagnostic tool that provides a performance report of the hearing aid. It will actually remind you when it's time for your follow-up visit! If you're interested in this particular aid, it's called the Destiny 1600 and runs around \$2400. Keep in mind that the best hearing aid features will cost more. If you just want the basics, Starkey has those as well.

For models like the Davinci PSP line, the cost can be as much as \$2200. The Sierra line sells for \$1700. Starkey's Axent line sells for \$2100. The Aspect Xtra sells for \$2100. There are lower cost Starkey products, such as the Starkey A13 MPT-1 and the Starkey A13 Sequel MMP BTE-1. Aids along this line can run anywhere from \$570 to \$1400.

What To Look For In Inexpensive Hearing Aids

Maybe this is the way you want to go about getting inexpensive hearing aids.

Your best bet is to look for deals on well-known brands and models of hearing aids. These can be found at better prices than the manufacturer offers, if you look on the internet. Just make sure you are comparing the exact same brand names and models of hearing aids to the same inexpensive hearing aids you have found. Also, make sure that they are new and have a warranty. Find out about trial periods and return policies. If you go through your ENT doctor, you will find that you will be given a rather long trial period. At any time during this period, you can bring the hearing aids back for a full refund minus a very small restocking fee. The same policy does not go for all sellers, especially internet sellers.

Another thing to look for is how the inexpensive hearing aids are fitted, both in physical conformity to your ear canal and in volume, frequency, and sound memories. Some

Some of these inexpensive hearing aids can be fitted through an ENT doctor and some are done without any doctor. Whatever you choose to do about your hearing problems, look for reliable yet inexpensive hearing aids for the solution.

What You Need To Know About To Compare Hearing Aids

You have just realized you have hearing loss. Or, you have recently gained the ability to do something about it. Now you have to sort through all the different styles, models, and manufacturers to find the right ones for you. You can no doubt get some help from your audiologist, but if you want to be an informed consumer, you will want to learn to compare hearing aids for yourself.

When you do compare hearing aids, the first question is whether you want to get analog or digital hearing aids. Analog are the least expensive by far. These hearing aids simply receive a signal from a microphone, amplify it, and send the louder sound on to the ear. It's as simple as that.

There is a middle ground between analog and digital. These are sometimes called digital programmable, although they are not 100 percent digital, or they are called analog programmable. The idea here is that it is indeed an analog hearing aid. It just has the advantage of a certain amount of customization in programming through the use of computer software. This can give you a variety of settings you can manually switch to accommodate your listening preferences in different listening situations. The settings can be changed by reprogramming at any time. When you compare hearing aids, these are more expensive than the regular analog ones, but less so than fully digital ones.

Fully digital hearing aids are the most expensive, and when you compare hearing aids you will find many reasons why this is so. The difference in sound quality is like the difference you get when you go to digital music recordings from old fashioned record albums. This is done through DSP, or digital signal processing.

There are differences in the programming as well. One thing to notice when you compare hearing aids is how many channels or bands it has. This is important because if your hearing loss is not the same for all frequencies, you will want different frequencies adjusted differently. Some people may only need a couple of bands while others may need several.

It is also nice to know if a hearing aid has directional microphones. If it does, there are two microphones that emphasize sounds in front of you rather than behind you. Some models have a switch so that you can turn this feature on and off.

Compare hearing aids by noting which ones are "smart" hearing aids. These have the capability to learn your preferences by the way you use them when you get them. Other features are reduced feedback and wind noise, and the ability to use the device with phones or even mobile phones.

There are digital hearing aids available without a doctor's prescription or testing. Some of the aids you can buy that go in the ear canal are digi-ears, which range from \$300 to \$700 and have various additions. They're versatile to fit either ear, so if you bought two of the same type, you wouldn't have to worry about which aid would fit each ear if you got confused.

Many different digital hearing aids are available. Some of them include a two channel value aid, which is a low cost aid, a mid-level four channel aid that provides feedback reduction and a speech amplifier, and the best level (also a four channel aid), which offers echo suppression and layered noise reduction. All of these aids come with a wax remover. (Wax seems to be a problem for hearing aid wearers and must be kept to a minimum for the best reception.)

You may want a carrying case for your digital hearing aid, to keep it safe by the bedside or in the nightstand while you sleep. The carrying case can help protect it from insects or dust or even a naughty cat who likes to knock things off furniture! Keeping your digital aid clean and dry is important for proper function and long-lasting use.

Digital aids use microprocessors to process sound for you to hear and should adjust volume according to sound levels. There are different frequency levels an aid must allow for; each level will have its own amount of hearing loss. This makes the correct purchase of an aid even more important. An ill fit, improper adjustment, or neglect to the proper levels you will need help with are reasons you should be properly tested and should use a professional to help you choose the right aid for you. Your lifestyle and budget are, of course, two other important factors to consider. You'll want to work with a quality hearing aid supplier, purchase an aid made by a reputable company, and go through the proper medical channels to help you make the best decision.

Almost any company that sells hearing aids will now have digital aids available for purchase. Digital aids can reduce or eliminate feedback while the person wears them. They have gain processing, which reduces microphone noise and environmental sounds. Telecoil Hearing Aids

A very useful feature found in most behind the ear hearing aids and some in the ear hearing aids is the telecoil. It's also sometimes known as a t-switch or t-coil. Telecoils allow the hearing aid to receive signals from different electronic sources. They can provide better sound quality and eliminate background noise in certain situations. Telecoils can be used with some telephones, FM radio systems and public address systems.

A telecoil consists of wire wrapped around a metal core. This allows a telecoil to produce through induction an electrical signal when in the presence of an electromagnetic field. Thus telecoils will pick up magnetic signals like a microphone picks up a sound signal. The telecoil will bypass the hearing aid's microphone and transmit this signal directly to the hearing aid's processing circuits for amplification.

The telecoil was originally designed to be used with old-style telephones. This is where the name telecoil comes from. These phones produced a strong magnetic field from the speakers in the ear piece. The telecoil would allow its user to hear the telephone better, as it would allow the user to not amplify the background noise.

Newer phones do not produce the same strong magnetic fields as older phones. However, most phones are designated as hearing aid compatible, or HAC. This means that they can produce the signals needed for the telecoil to work properly. In addition, many movie theaters, auditoriums, and sports stadiums provide assistive listening systems to those patrons that require them. These generally take the form of hearing aid compatible headsets or receivers which can be borrowed by those who need them.

There are also a series of loop devices that can produce the magnetic fields needed by telecoils. They are generally hooked directly into a sound source like a television, radio or PA system. The three types of loop devices are room loops, neck loops, and silhouettes. Room loops are built into a room, either in the ceiling, floor or baseboards. The magnetic signal they produce can be used by everyone in the room, making them suitable for areas where there are many hearing aid users, like a church or nursing home. A neck loop and a silhouette are both single user devices, the neck loop being the size of a necklace, and the silhouette being even

smaller and designed to fit behind the ear.

Do You Need Hearing Aids?

If you suspect you have hearing loss you need to visit your family doctor. They can check for signs of a medical condition that would affect your hearing. Of the two types of hearing loss, conductive and sensorineural, it is sensorineural hearing loss that is generally corrected with a hearing aid. Your doctor will examine your ear with an instrument called an otoscope. With an otoscope, your doctor can see if there are any abnormalities in your ear canal or eardrum. The next step is to conduct a full hearing test. One portion of this test is the pure tone testing, which measures how well you hear different frequencies. You will be asked to listen to a series of tones at various volumes, and to indicate when you hear them. Each ear will be tested separately. Another type of pure tone tests involves the placement of a small bone conductor behind your ear, which allows sound waves to be transmitted directly to the cochlea of the inner ear, bypassing the middle and outer ear.

After the pure tone tests, you most likely will have to take a series of speech tests. Here you will be asked to detect and understand speech. You will hear a series of words that you will be asked to repeat. The words will vary in intensity and length. An impedance test is used to measure the transmission of sound through the middle ear. An audiologist will check this by placing a probe in your ear and measuring the transmission of various tones and frequencies at different air pressures.

The results of a hearing test are usually presented in a chart known as an audiogram. Your audiologist will explain this chart to you. It will show your perception of different frequencies, and compares that with the expected values. An audiogram is a useful tool in measuring the progress of hearing loss over time. An audiogram will present the results in terms of decibels. A decibel is a logarithmic measure of sound intensity. Zero decibels is defined as the intensity that a normal person can hear fifty percent of the time. A normal conversation occurs at about forty five decibels, and one hundred and twenty decibels is the noise a 747 would make while taking off.

Shopping For Hearing Aids

The first thing to do if you suspect you have hearing loss is to see your family doctor. They can check your ears for signs of blockage or infection. If neither is present, they may send you to either an otolaryngologist or an audiologist. An otolaryngologist is an ear, nose and throat doctor, and can best diagnose medical problems with your ears. An audiologist is a professional with an advanced degree. They specialize in testing for hearing loss and hearing aid fitting. It is also possible to obtain a hearing aid directly from a hearing aid dealer or consultant. They will be trained to test for hearing loss, and to fit and sell hearing aids.

The next step is to get a full hearing test. This should consist of several different tests, including the lowest sound you can hear, how well you can hear speech in different environments, and how well you tolerate loud noises. Your perception of different tones or frequencies should also be measured.

You should discuss with your doctor or audiologist whether a hearing aid is the best solution for you, or whether it is possible to correct your hearing loss through surgery.

Next you'll want to select the hearing aid that is right for you. Make sure you investigate the three main styles of hearing aids (BTE, ITE, and CIC). Most hearing aid companies offer a trial period, so don't be hesitant to try more than one aid. You will want to choose a hearing aid that is both comfortable and will most effectively improve your hearing. Learn what features are available with the different hearing aids; in particular telecoil is a useful feature that you should seriously consider. You may want to ask about the possibility of direct audio input which would allow you to use assistive listening devices which can be found in some schools, movies theatres and other public auditoriums.

It is important to understand all the costs of a hearing aid, including batteries and repairs. You may end up going through batteries quite frequently, so remember to compare expected battery life with the price per battery. At this time it is also important to learn what the warranty covers, and for how long. It may be worth it to extend the warranty.

A new hearing aid can be a disorienting experience. Become familiar with your hearing aid.

Make sure you are comfortable putting in and taking out the aid, adjusting the volume control, and replacing the batteries before you leave the audiologist. A common complaint of new hearing aid users is that their own voices may sound too loud. This usually takes some time to get used to. Another problem is feedback, where your hearing aid produces a whistle. This is caused by the fit of the hearing aid or by the buildup of earwax or fluid. You will need to see your audiologist for adjustments.

Maintaining Your Hearing Aids

In order to get a long and productive life from your hearing aid, it is very important to maintain it properly. Hearing aids are delicate instruments, and looking after them properly is vital. You will need to know how to clean your hearing aid by removing wax buildup, how to replace and dispose of batteries and how to remove moisture from the aid.

You should put together a kit for maintaining your hearing aids. In this kit you will want a battery tester and spare batteries, silica gel packs and a plastic stethoscope. In addition, if you have a behind the ear hearing aid you will want a forced air ear mold blower. Dead batteries are probably the most common cause of hearing aid malfunction. You will want to replace dead batteries immediately. The spare batteries you have in your kit will be very useful when this occurs. There is nothing worse than been stuck with dead batteries when you have an event to go to! You will want to remember to turn off your hearing aids when you're not using them in order to prolong the battery life. The silica gel packs are used to prevent moisture from getting into your hearing aid while you are not wearing it.

It is generally a good idea to keep hearing aids away from heat and moisture. Avoid using hairspray or other hair care products while wearing your hearing aid. Keep your hearing aid clean by wiping it with a tissue daily. Make sure you check for damage such as cracks, broken parts, clogged openings or moisture.

Every day, check to make sure that your hearing aid is working properly by listening to it through the stethoscope. Vary the volume while doing this to ensure that the sound is clear and strong without any static or unusual sounds. To make sure the hearing aid is producing a clear sound for you, set the hearing aid to a volume where you like to listen through the hearing aid. Ensure that the hearing aid is not cutting in and out.

The only part of a hearing aid that should be washed is the ear mold piece of a behind the ear hearing aid. Gently wash it with a mild detergent or an ear mold cleaning kit. The forced air blower can be used to dry the ear mold more quickly. The plastic tubing should be checked for stiffness and cracks. It will probably need to be replaced every six months or so.

In the ear and smaller hearing aids should be cleaned with a dry tissue and small brush on a daily basis. Do not attempt to wash them with a damp cloth, as this will damage them.

If you are having any problems with your hearing aid, take it back to the dispenser or audiologist to ensure that it is still properly adjusted for you. The hearing aid will be of no use to you if you do not wear it, so it makes sense to properly maintain it.

Improvements To Hearing Aids

Many hearing aids now have directional microphones. These can be a major improvement in areas with a lot of background noise, like restaurants and public spaces. The directional microphone allows the user to focus on the sound source they wish to listen to, and to reduce amplification of conversations behind and to the sides. It is common for such a hearing aid to have both a directional microphone and conventional microphone. Thus user can switch between them as the situation warrants.

Modern digital signal processing has allowed hearing aid designers to develop devices that can actively reduce background noise. These require a fairly significant level of processing, and techniques are continuously being developed in order to increase the effectiveness of the hearing aid. While it is desirable to increase the signal to noise ratio, it is often hard to discriminate the desired sound from the background noise.

Digitally programmable hearing aids can be programmed to have a variable frequency response. They can also be setup to have a series of different settings that are appropriate for different situations and levels of background noise. The user can switch between the different settings as needed.

While telecoils have been available for some time, more hearing aids are being developed with a direct audio input, or DAI. This allows the hearing aid to be connected to an external audio source like a CD player or television. This is preferred by many over a telecoil, as there is less interference. DAI is usually available only in behind the ear hearing aids. They usually use a wire to connect the hearing aid to the external source.

Recent advances in hearing aid technology include the use of wireless technology. This would have the same purpose as direct audio input, without the wires. A person with a wireless hearing aid would also have an FM transmitter that they could hook up to the television, or to a clip on microphone that could be given to someone they wish to have a conversation with.

Disposable Hearing Aids

Disposable hearing aids are simpler than conventional hearing aids. They are currently being marketed to the baby boomer population, with the thought that devices that can be cheaper for people with only mild or moderate hearing loss. Unlike conventional hearing aids, they are not custom-fitted. They usually cannot be adjusted, and instead come in a variety of configurations or prescriptions, selected to match the user's level of hearing loss. A disposable hearing aid's batteries cannot be replaced. They are designed to be thrown out after the batteries expire, which usually last for just over a month. Disposable hearing aids will offer similar quality as a conventional analog hearing aid.

The idea behind disposable hearing aids is that they will appeal to those people who are not sure if they need a hearing aid, and do not wish to spend the money required to purchase a conventional hearing aid. Disposable hearing aids usually cost between \$40 and \$50 each. This compares to a conventional digital hearing aid which can cost up to five thousand dollars for a pair. While a conventional hearing aid should last for about five years, the overall price of disposable hearing aid may be slightly more expensive. However, there is not as much money tied up in the device at any one time, making replacement much easier. A disposable hearing aid can be available immediately after a hearing test. There is no need to wait for it to be manufactured like a conventional hearing aid. The potential cost of repair or replacement batteries is eliminated as if the device breaks; you just throw it out and get a new one. If the device is lost or dropped, the cost of a replacement is far less than for a conventional hearing aid.

While disposable hearing aids are sometimes described as one size fits all, they actually fit about 80% of adult male ears and about 60% of adult female ears, although some products advertise a higher rate of match. Most disposable aids are of the in the ear type. However, instead of being molded to the ear, they make use of a soft cap that provides an acoustic seal about halfway down the ear canal.

A disposable hearing aid does have a short life span. They cannot be custom fit, meaning they may be uncomfortable for some people. And disposable hearing aids are not as flexible as modern digital hearing aids, which can be programmed to respond differently in a wide variety of

situations. Perhaps the biggest concern of audiologists about disposable hearing aids is that users of them will not have their hearing checked on a regular basis, leading to potential uncorrected problems.

All About Open Fit Hearing Aids

The number of choices offered for a hearing aid, in the market, is overwhelming. This article talks about open fit hearing aids that are in the market. In the case of an open fit hearing aid, one does not have to wait for the ear mould to be prepared, and then returned to you, this makes the time taken comparatively lesser than the latter. These make your job easier when you get it from the dealer. The open type hearing aids have evolved a lot and are less bulky now, and they even come in various colors, and also in user friendly designs. The quality has also increased, and people are happy wearing the ones that are coming now.

Many people do not accept the point that they require help to function properly. It is not a shame to accept the fact that they need help in hearing properly, but often, people consider this to be a matter of pride, and stay away from hearing aid. The children fear about being teased by others, and also care about the insults that they will have to face from the society to be wearing a hearing aid at this age, and they also feel that the hearing aid diminishes their looks. The adults see it as a sign of getting older.

The open fit hearing aids are referred to as over-the-ear hearing aids, or OTE. These are to make the wearer feel comfortable, as they are fitted behind the ear, and with an invisible plastic tube that goes into the ear near the ear canal.

OTE hearing aids are best for hearing defects of high frequency. You must be knowing that the hearing defects varies from person to person. The loss occurs at different levels, and also at different stages. In case of the open fitting hearing aids, the power given is mainly for the defect due to high frequencies.

There is another name for these OTE aids, they are also referred to as BTE hearing aids, behind-the-ear hearing aids. The tubing is of plastic, the tubing, and the ear mould conduct sound keeping the ear mould open. Open fit aids are best suited for children, but adults also wear them. These usually come in bright colors to attract the kids.

Even the mailed product, should not be sent to you without a proper test report from the audiologist. The audiologists are not professional doctors who decide on the medical conditions and illness, but they are mere testers. But, they can send an audiogram that is used to alter the hearing aid settings.

Good deals on behind-the-ear hearing aids can be struck on E-Bay. Recently, a reconditioned aid was sold there for a mere \$70. It is a Beltone hearing aid, which is supposedly one of the best companies and a original hearing aid costs over \$1000, when being purchased new. The 278 BTE, which is from Siemens is also a famous model, and costs around \$200. These are good quality deals on the hearing aids, online.

Some of the sellers who sell their hearing aids online deal directly with the professionals. These are generally sold at very low prices when compared to the thousands of dollars that are usually sold for. A hearing aid from Siemens, named Siemens Intuis is offered for \$499, and its original cost lies somewhere around \$1800. It consists of even microphones that are directional, and

The centre offers a plans to help dogs get used to wearing a hearing aid. Over a month the volume of the aid is gradually adjusted to the right level for the dog. The price is about \$250 for each aid. The programs are designed to ease a dog gently into wearing a hearing aid and get used to the idea with the least discomfort.

There is a contraption available for dogs as a hearing aid which easily fits onto their collar. The aid comes in a container which is collar mounted, with a tube leading from it to a foam plug which is placed in the dog's ear. This is very much structured like the BTE, that is Behind the Ear, hearing aids. These devices tend to be tolerated by smaller dogs, as the larger dogs don't take to them as well.

Some pet veterinary insurance companies do actually cover the cost of these devices.

The DSP works by sorting the sounds into channels of frequencies which are split into lower and higher pitches, that is what speech sounds are made up of. By not getting the full range of these audible frequencies, you will not be able to pick up all the sounds so what you will hear is jumbled up speech. With the BTE Digital Hearing Aids you are given the power to amplify the sound even more so that you distinguish voices much more easier.

These hearing aids treats continuous noise differently to how they process noises which have a shorter duration. For instance, the doorbell ringing would interest you more than the sound of

Some of these hearing aids come with two microphones so that the wearer can focus on the sound coming from the front, known as directionality. This is to provide less distraction which you can get from the environment surrounding you.

With a BTE Digital Hearing Aids offers the best of both worlds. They are durable enough and so easy that a child can use them, with the added advantage of the modern digital sound processing. It provides better hearing for most.

The more channels there are then this is better as the fitter is given more latitude to accommodate your hearing losses through the ranges that are not consistent. Having more channels means that your audiologist can amplify the frequencies and tailor them to your needs so that you get more or less hearing where it is needed. If your discount hearing aid does not have the same channels that you find in the manufacturers' hearing aids, the response to programming will be different.

Look at the data carefully of both hearing aids so that you compare it with the model of the manufacturers as you want to make sure you are getting the same hearing aid with microphones which are the same in directional capability. Not all models have directional microphones so if it is featured in one and not the other, then you are not getting the same as the manufacturer's which is what you were expecting.

You also need to check the memory presets of the hearing aids to see how many there are and the brand name. They will tell you if you are getting what an original brand would offer but at a discount price. We all have personal preferences as more memory is not always better, so just be sure you have an adequate number and type of memory presents that you need.

There are also other types of hearing aids like the ITE, that is 'In the Ear', which fit right inside the ear. To determine which hearing aid is best for you tests will be performed on you to measure your degree of hearing loss including: audiometry, auditory brainstem response, emissions, otoacoustic, tuning fork and whispered speech. An audiologist is someone trained to evaluate hearing defects and treat them, and can determine the best type of hearing aid for you by looking at all the data from your tests. With some people there is added bone growth that interferes with how sound waves transmit. Surgery can stop or reverse this problem about 70% of the time. In the meantime, a hearing aid is useful before surgery, or if you still have some degree of hearing loss following surgery it may still be necessary to use one.

Hearing Aids GA: For A Good Fit

The modern hearing aids of today are usually programmed using a computer in one way or another before they are fitted. The technology of Hearing Aids GA was designed to give a fitting that is more precise. An audiologist uses this tool that is relatively new to give you the hearing experience that you desire.

The GA, for Hearing Aids GA, is for genetic algorithms. Firstly, is to look at what algorithms are so as to understand them. An algorithm is determining how something gets done. There are often different ways to do something to achieve a goal. The algorithm is the chosen way of doing something. All algorithms have their advantages and disadvantages, although they all accomplish the same goal basically. We all have varying pathology so we have our own unique algorithm which is used to program a digital hearing aid so that it fits with good results. Each result is different for each user for the fitting of their hearing device.

These algorithms are so called genetic algorithms because the elements found in biological genetic principles are mimicked. One example is natural selection where a set of parameters is discarded if it is found to be weaker or less useful than another set, that is, it does not get selected. Hearing Aids GA does have a few possibilities but is able to do the job of rating each selection and picking out the best one for you.

This will be done when you go for your fitting. The audiologist will normally give you two options as presented by the Hearing Aids GA, and you select the one which you find better. It carries on giving you two options until all the information is processed to arrive at a conclusion according to your preferences.

In one study, subjects with normal hearing were tested by being given speech sounds that were distorted to listen to. The Hearing Aids GA looked at their preferences and programmed to give the overall best solution for the problem, which it did in most cases. A second study was done with the subjects to see if the same preferences came up again in the feedback from a second time. Indeed they were. This technology is proven to give an accurate fitting for the majority of individuals which is excellent.

In order for it to be practical long term and continue to be effective, they should be capable to adjust to a user's change in preferences. Artificial intelligent design is important in these instances in being responsive to the wearer's actual use.

Some Hearing Aids GA now come with Bluetooth technology so that it be downloaded to a program which communicates with the hearing aid. There is where the audiologist comes in as they are the only one professionally trained to do the fitting. They are not developed enough that you can do it by yourself.

It is a great advantage having hearing aids that are digitally programmable. The programming is the most important part and that is what Hearing Aids GA does, so that you get a fitting which doesn't take long and is as accurate as it can be.

How Do Hearing Aids Work?

Hearing aids came about more than two hundred years ago. They first appeared as conical shaped ear trumpets and horns which were held up to the ear so a person could speak into it. Sound travelled down the funnel directly into the hearing impaired person to enable them to hear. Hearing aids have come a long way since then with many impressive types which work with the higher level of technology today. Now we will look at how hearing aids work in today's modern world.

Hearing aids have small microphones which pick up sound which is then amplified to make it louder. A small microphone receives the sound coming in where it is then converted into an electrical or digital signal, the data is then sent back to a speaker so it becomes sound again. The microphones are set according to a person's hearing loss in their usual environment and will account for that to make hearing as normal as possible. The environment will refer to the usual sound and noises that are around you on a daily basis. If you are around high frequency noises, is it necessary to be able to hear them? Are you mainly in an environment where conversation is quiet? The audiologist will ask the relevant questions and then determine how to adjust the settings on your hearing aid to help you. This provides some information for how hearing aids function.

Hearing aids today use one of the three basic types of technology for converting the signals they receive. The analogue adjustable hearing aid is the cheapest and least advanced. Adjustments are carried out by your audiologist like the volume as well as other specifications. The hearing aid is then custom made to fit you. The volume is controlled automatically, or you can adjust it yourself.

The next type is the analog programmable one which is better than the analogue adjustable as it can be programmed with the use of a computer. The audiologist is able to set the different programs to capture and transmit sound for the differing listening situations that one comes across. As a user you have the option of choosing the program for any given situation, with a remote control.

The most advanced is the digital programmable hearing aids which work out the more expensive. It took years to perfect the technology as they were impractical or not small enough, and now they are very discreet for the wearer.

So what makes a hearing aid work? The circuitry consists of a feature known as DSP, which is Digital Sound Processing. The utilization of a computer chip takes the sound data and analyses it, then once processed it is then amplified to the ear. The data is made up of billions of digital number codes which are identified and classified into different sounds to give them their correct settings. This data is then converted back into sound which is sent to the ear. As the digital hearing air can identify different frequencies, feedback can be detected and eliminated so there is no background interference for the user. This is what makes it much better than the analogue types, as they work automatically and usually need little or no adjustment.

With advancing technology hearing aids just get better and smaller, offering many options for the hearing impaired. They are barely noticeable which make it less embarrassing to wear one, so if you haven't already, you should go ahead and improve your hearing.

The ear hooks that an aid is equipped with is made of extremely thin tubing which is quite a bonus. Some of the aid compartments which is the part that sits behind the ear are very
